In 1976 *American History Illustrated Magazine* published Bob's article "Banjos on Their Saddlehorns," which told the story of the banjo in the "Old West." The magazine has long been unavailable. Years later Hal Allert, who at the time had a website called classicbanjo.com, made an unusual request. He had only a partial copy of the article, and asked if Bob could record it and make it available for his banjo blog.

Bob took this idea to Dave Peloquin at Night Sail Studios in Windsor, Maine. Dave spent a great deal of time recording him reading the original typescript, which varied in details from the article as published. At Bob's request, he added illustrative banjo music, which was drawn from the work of several friends and fellow banjo players whose CDs deserve much wider circulation.
